Glasgow School, G. M. Ellwood Style. Arts & Crafts Enamel Towel Rail

A *Glasgow School* towel rail in the style of **G. M. Ellwood**, probably made by **J. S. Henry**, with arched creasting rails, three horizontal bars, and square-section supports on stepped feet. Finished in white enamel paint.

The *Glasgow School* was a progressive movement of the late 19th and early 20th centuries, combining *Arts & Crafts* ideals with *Art Nouveau* geometry, producing designs that were both functional and modern in spirit, often with clean lines and subtle stylisation.
